**Seeing Miró go 'bittersweet'**

As Joan Miro's great mosaic is temporarily removed, WSU Foundation announces \$3 million campaign to support conservation of world masterpiece

In typical glitzy Ulrich Museum of Art fashion — complete with human statues, free T-shirts and confetti — spectators gathered at the museum's main entrance on Tuesday, Sept. 27, to "See Miró Go."

The splashy, once-in-a-lifetime event commemorated the de-installation of the campus icon and world masterpiece, Joan Miró's Personnages Oiseaux (Bird People), from the building's façade. It also marked the beginning of the conservation effort to save the great mosaic.

"This is a somewhat bittersweet moment," said Patricia McDonnell, Ulrich Museum of Art director, speaking

to the crowd. "But it's our responsibility to care for this work."

At the event, Elizabeth King, Wichita State University Foundation president and CEO, publicly announced the WSU Foundation's \$3 million fundraising campaign to support the mosaic's conservation and the museum.

Of the overall goal, \$2.2 million will go toward direct costs related to the conservation of the masterpiece and \$800,000 will be designated for improvements to the Ulrich Museum facilities to care and maintain its artwork collection, she said.

As evidenced by the falling tiles during the last few years, the

## Shelli Herman '88 believes personal success came from WSU experiences

Shelli Herman has gone from a Wichita State University student to an annual fund donor to establishing a scholarship in her own name, all while using her entrepreneurial skills to create her own business.

Herman received her Bachelor of Arts in social work from WSU in 1988. She says those four years were some of the best she can remember.

"Being a Shocker was not only a great deal of fun, but these years shaped everything I have done in my life from that point forward," Herman said. "Some of my greatest skills as a leader and manager of people came from WSU."

Crediting her leadership experiences learned at WSU, Herman began giving back at the age of 23, only one year after graduating. She said that although that gift was \$25, she knew it mattered.

"I think everyone can give in a way that's comfortable for them and still feel really good about the overall impact," she said.

As the years progressed, Herman's gifts increased, and in 2007, the Shelli Herman Leadership and Achievement Scholarship was established. Herman said that she received several scholarships that were beneficial to her.

"Financially, it made a huge difference for my family and me," she said. "From an esteem perspective, it's also relevant because it tells a student that they are doing well, that others recognize this accomplishment and that we want them to continue to be successful."

Success blessed Herman with the recent opportunity to launch her own company, Shelli Herman and Associates. After working 15 years with a retained executive search firm in Los Angeles, Herman decided to create her own. Working with client companies, she and her associates find talented candidates versus individuals who are simply looking for a position at a top level within an organization.

"The business has far exceeded my expectations," she said. "Initially, I thought the company would remain small and now I can say it's growing beyond that!"

Herman said she owes everything she has now to her experiences as a student leader and scholar at

WSU and feels that giving back to her alma mater is the right thing to do.

"One of the things my leadership experience taught me at Wichita State, and particularly as a member of Delta Gamma, is that we have an obligation to give back or do well," she said.

With the economic challenges of today's world, Herman said it is important for alumni, young or old, to know that they have a key responsibility to give back in some way in order to continue to help students at Wichita State set the stage for their lives as leaders and philanthropists.

"I cannot think of a more deserving place than WSU, nor can I think of a more compelling reason beyond the basic importance of philanthropy as a core value or placeholder in terms of what matters," Herman said. "I see my gifts as the right thing to do and I am so happy that the impact will be seen by a deserving student."

## Fundraising effort to rename Rhatigan Student Center Ballroom in honor of First Lady Shirley Beggs

Celebrate! Elizabeth King, WSU Foundation president and CEO; First Lady Shirley Beggs; Jim Rhatigan, WSU consultant; Velma Wallace and WSU President Don Beggs toast to the renaming of the Shirley Beggs Ballroom.

The ballroom in the Rhatigan Student Center is the popular meeting place for many professional and social gatherings for Wichita State students, faculty and staff, and the Wichita community. Next spring it will be part of the Rhatigan Renewal — and its new proposed name will honor our First Lady, Shirley Beggs.

One of the early ideas for the ballroom came from Jim Herrman, Rhatigan Student Center (RSC) director, who felt it would be appropriate to name the ballroom for Beggs because she and the president entertain there so often.

"There is not a better hostess, ambassador and representative of our university than Shirley," said Elizabeth King, WSU Foundation president and CEO. "Completing the fundraising to create the Shirley Beggs Ballroom, during the last months of the Beggs' tenure, would be most gratifying and would recognize Shirley's significant impact on WSU."

The namesake of the ballroom was a key factor when Jim Rhatigan, WSU Foundation consultant, began

soliciting funds. He is champion of the Foundation's fundraising campaign to raise 10 percent of the total \$33 million Rhatigan Renewal project.

"It is easy to understand why people respond so positively to Shirley," said Rhatigan. "She is a happy, outgoing and wholly authentic woman. Her focus always is on others, a rare and very effective quality."

The first time Beggs saw the plans, she made suggestions only because she has held many events there over the past 13 years and knew some changes that needed to be made. She believed they would make the operations of the ballroom more workable for everyone using it over the next 50 years. But, she didn't know about the new name.

"When I was told, I burst into tears," said Beggs. "Never in my wildest imagination did I dream of anything being named for me. It is a total honor and something I will cherish for the rest of my life."

Though a widespread appeal for the \$500,000 ballroom renovation and expansion has yet to begin,

according to Rhatigan, Velma Wallace readily agreed to give the lead gift. Additional gifts to-date have come from John and Kaye Morse, Mickey Armstrong, Don and Elizabeth King and Don Beggs. Currently, nearly \$350,000 have been raised and additional gifts are pending.

"Elizabeth King introduced me to Shirley about 13 years ago at a social event," said Wallace. "It was the beginning of a great relationship. Our friendship has continued to deepen as we have shared many experiences."

"The renaming of the ballroom will be a lasting recognition of Shirley's personal impact on Wichita State University, its students, extended WSU community and the City of Wichita."

The ballroom will be expanded to 7,810 square feet and will be able to be divided into two rooms with soundproof partitions between. There will be a meeting room to the east, a spacious lounge to the north and an adjoining patio where people can look out onto the campus.

## Donor support helped Rachel Schmidt accomplish her A plan

When Rachel Schmidt decided to apply to physical therapy school during the final year as a Shocker undergraduate, she applied to Wichita State — and only Wichita State, though she was told to send applications to more than one school.

"I put all my eggs in one basket and I took a risk applying only to WSU," said Schmidt. "I had no plan B."

Her gamble paid off. After receiving a bachelor's in exercise science with a minor in Spanish in 2010, she was accepted into the physical therapy program and now is beginning her second year as a doctorate student.

Throughout her college career, with the help of scholarships

and fellowships, including, most recently, the Sam and Rosemary Scherr Memorial Scholarship/Fellowship, the Nygaard Family College of Health Professions Endowed Fellowship, the James J. Rhatigan Leadership Scholarship and Fellowship and the Lenora N. McGregor Scholarship, Schmidt has been able to focus on her studies, be active on campus and keep the cost of her education low.

"I'm so thankful for the scholarships I received as an undergraduate because they allowed me to graduate debt-free. Graduate school tuition and textbooks are expensive, so the fellowships I've been blessed with have helped me quite a bit."

As an undergraduate, Schmidt

was not only focused on her studies, she also was active in several campus organizations, which included the Student Ambassador Society, Future Healthcare Professionals and the Student Government Association. Schmidt also worked as a tour guide for WSU admissions.

"I did so much because I wanted to somehow give back to the university."

Now, after receiving financial assistance from several donors, she has been moved and inspired by them.

Schmidt hopes to be in a position one day where she can give back to Wichita State and help others fulfill their A plans.

## Love of music passed on to others through Beverly Coldsnow Hutton Scholarship spreading her love

Beverly Hutton has spent much of her life dedicated to helping others through her love of music.

As a child, Hutton remembers listening to her mother playing the piano as she lie awake in bed at night.

"I loved every piece that she played, and I told myself, 'I will play that someday,'" she said.

After "flying through the beginner books," Hutton said she was hooked. By the time she was a sophomore at Wichita East High School, she was teaching younger children piano lessons.

"My goal was always to be a music teacher because I felt it was an important discipline for children of any age," she said.

"After my first two years at U of W, I loved it," Hutton said. "I was involved in Mu Phi Epsilon, Alpha Tau Sigma and had dozens of friends. I liked my professors in the school of music and felt as if

I couldn't do any better anywhere else. It was perfect for me!"

After graduating with her Bachelor of Music Education in 1949, Hutton immediately began sharing her passion for music. Whether it be the church choir, piano lessons out of her home or playing the organ at church, Hutton was sharing her love of music.

In 1955, Hutton started the choir at Dawson United

Methodist Church in Wichita. Although she still occasionally directs, she formally gave up her position after 50 years. Her reason for leaving?

"I didn't want to be that 'old lady that we can't get rid of!'" she said.

During her stint as the choir director, Hutton began teaching vocal music at Oaklawn Elementary School, part of the Derby School District. She also returned to Wichita State and received her Master of Music Education in 1975.

Although Hutton has since retired from teaching at Oaklawn, she currently serves as the pianist at Dawson United Methodist Church, sings in the choir and substitutes, when needed, for the current choir director, who is a former student of Hutton's.

Hutton's three children established a scholarship in her name this year: the Beverly Coldsnow Hutton Scholarship. In the November online Horizon, we'll continue this story from her children's perspective.

When I started college, my mom and dad couldn't afford it, but they provided me with seed money to get started the first semester. If I can provide a similar seed to students every year, I'll be very pleased.

I believe in the future of Wichita State because being in the largest city in Kansas, students are positioned well for real world applications with local industry and opportunities for employment.

I started a scholarship a few years ago and hope to add to it in future years and at my death. In order to attract students to WSU, I feel that scholarships are important. I have also chosen to earmark a specific dollar amount from my revocable trust at my death. When you make a gift such as this, the personal satisfaction that you receive in return is worth more than what you give away.

## Are You Landlocked?

You may not be landlocked in the traditional sense, but perhaps your charitable potential is locked up in land or other real estate. The WSU Foundation accepts gifts of farm or ranch land, personal residences and vacation homes. By gifting one of these types of property, you may realize tax benefits and support the WSU programs of your choice.

For many of us, real estate can represent one of the largest assets we own. Real estate also gives us a number of charitable giving options.

In spring 2011, Justus Fugate '60, '62 and members of his family gifted 160 acres of farm and ranch land to the WSU Foundation for the benefit of student scholarships in music and mathematics.

“It was a convenient way for multiple family owners (all with a minority interest) of a small farm to honor our parents,” said Fugate.

### Direct transfer of ownership

As an outright gift or bequest, real estate can be transferred directly to the WSU Foundation. In most cases, the property will then be sold with the assets directed toward support of the WSU program of your choice. In addition to the satisfaction of assisting WSU, you may realize an income tax deduction and avoid capital gains tax incurred if the appreciated property had been sold outright.

### Retained life estate

With a retained life estate, you gift a personal residence to the WSU Foundation and retain the right to occupy the property for life. You keep the use of the property and realize a charitable income tax deduction for the value of the remainder interest. After the retained life estate, the value of the real estate benefits your designated program.

### Using real estate to fund life income gifts

Real estate also may be used to fund charitable remainder trusts and charitable gift annuities, which pay you income for life. In this way, you are using your non-income producing property to create an income stream for you and a charitable gift to benefit WSU.

With a charitable remainder unitrust, the life income beneficiary receives a predetermined percentage of at least 5 percent of the trust assets as revalued annually. You gift your property to the

trust. The trust then sells the property to fund the life income payments with the remainder directed to the WSU Foundation to benefit the university program of your choice.

With a charitable gift annuity, the property would be received by the WSU Foundation and then sold, with the assets funding an annuity that would make payments to you for life. Annuity rates are recommended by the American Council on Gift Annuities and vary based on the age of the annuitant. For example, the payout rate for a deferred payment gift annuity for a donor age 65 with payouts deferred to age 70 would be 7 percent.

With both the charitable remainder trust and the charitable gift annuity, you may receive a charitable tax deduction and avoid capital gains tax on the appreciated value of the property. As most pieces of real estate are not income producing, the property must be sold to fund payments to the income beneficiaries. Net income unitrusts and deferred gift annuities provide time for sale of the property in order to make payments to the life income beneficiaries.

Gifts of real estate must be approved by the Real Estate Committee of the WSU Foundation. Real estate gifts typically require a Phase I Environmental Study and an independent appraisal provided by the donor.

## Reunion with old friends

### Retired WSU faculty and staff gather for annual breakfast event

What began as a small gathering of students and retired Wichita State University faculty and staff — and, of course, the event's originator, James Rhatigan — in 1968, the WSU Retirement Coffee has become an annual tradition. The special breakfast brings retirees back to campus and gives them an opportunity to reunite with old friends and reminisce about their time at the university.

Hosted by Rhatigan, WSU Foundation consultant, and the WSU Foundation, this year's event was held on Aug. 30 at the Marcus Welcome Center on the WSU campus. It was a success with nearly 150 attendees.

The audience heard comments

from First Lady Shirley Beggs, WSU President Don Beggs, Elizabeth King, WSU Foundation president and CEO; Keith Pickus, interim provost; and Ron Matson, associate professor of sociology. Additional presenters were Promise for the Future campaign cabinet members Julie Scherz, associate professor of the WSU Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders; and Phil May, professor emeritus of the WSU School of Accountancy. Entertainment was provided by musical theater students from the College of Fine Arts.

## Campaign helping to secure the future of WSU

In July 2010, the Wichita State University Foundation launched the Promise for the Future campaign. Continuing through June 2012, this effort is informing alumni and friends about the options available to extend their support of WSU through a legacy gift. Toward the campaign goal of 100 new planned gifts, through October 12, 61 gift commitments have been received.

While the tools used to make these planned gift commitments range from wills, trusts, retirement plans, life insurance and gift annuities, the donors share a common affinity for WSU. Barry and Cindy '77, '85 Schwan serve as co-chairs for the 13-member cabinet of the campaign. The cabinet meets bi-monthly to help guide the direction of this effort.

"It has been heartwarming to see the strong support of our alumni in providing for the future of the university through this campaign," said the Schwans.

The planned gifts completed during the campaign will provide future support for every college in the university, plus KMUW 89.1, the Ulrich Museum and Shocker athletics. The use of planned gifts is donor directed. In addition to defining the program of

support, donors also identify the type of assistance, ranging from student scholarships to faculty support and equipment or materials.

Michael Lamb, WSU Foundation vice president for planned and annual giving, noted that planned gifts are often tied to the positive WSU experiences of alumni and friends.

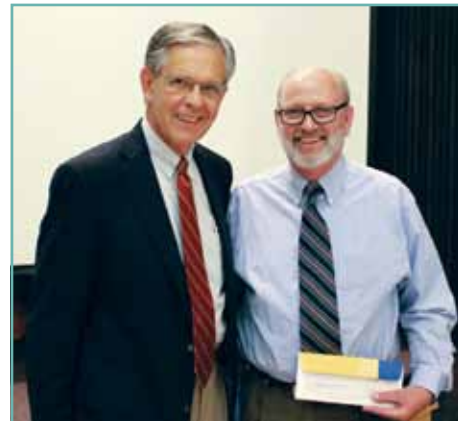
